In 2016/2017 the school's Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) Allocation is £10 860.

Barriers to educational achievement

The barriers for pupils include:

- Emotional – low self-esteem linked to low attainment. This also impacts pupil enjoyment in school life and therefore participation in the school day.
- Practical – cost for out of school clubs, music lessons and additional school events.
- Literacy and numeracy levels – Baselines for pupils highlight the low starting level for these pupils that then affects learning across the curriculum and consequently self-esteem.
